

Greek Mythology

Each day will begin with a different story from Greek Mythology, which we will explore through movement, acting, and art. For instance, the story of Echo and Narcissus will inspire a movement conversation in which members of the class create and echo the movements of those around them. The students will then be invited to imagine themselves as a plant or flower (as Narcissus was transformed into a flower) and either create a collage to illustrate their transformation or a self-portrait, of their own image reflected in a pool. For the myth of Pegasus, they will make flying horse puppets. Toward the end of the week, they may create their own mythological deities, imagining themselves as members of the Greek pantheon, complete with origin stories and corresponding symbols. *Please note: this class has a minimum enrollment number of 3 and a maximum capacity of 10.*

Age Group:

- Rising 4th/5th

Dates:

- Monday, July 17th - Friday, July 21st

Time:

- Afternoon (12:15 - 3:00 p.m.)
 - This class can be paired with a morning class (9:00 - 11:45 a.m.) to create a full day (9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.)
 - Students staying for the full day will have a lunch break from 11:45 a.m. and 12:15 p.m.
 - Extended day options can be added on prior to the start of morning classes (8:00 - 9:00 a.m.) and/or after afternoon classes (3:00 - 4:00 p.m.) for an additional cost (see below)

Cost: (for the 5 days)

- Each half-day specialty camp program: \$250
- Morning or afternoon extended: \$80
- Morning and afternoon extended: \$150
